PAPA OLA LŌKAHI:

Established in 1988 as a result of the passage of the Native Hawaiian Health Care Act and charged with raising the health status of Native Hawaiians to the highest possible level

Community-based, non-governmental entity that achieves its kuleana through strategic partnerships, programs and public policy

Serves as the body with which federal agencies shall enter into consultation around issues of Hawaiian health policy and health care

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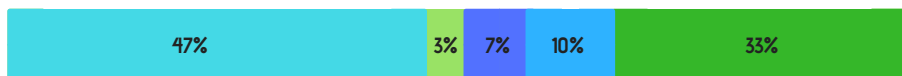
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NATIVE HAWAIIAN POPULATION :

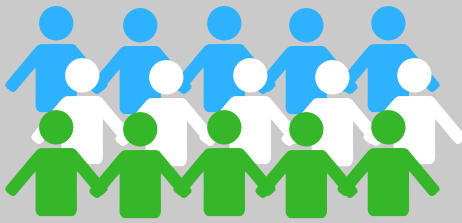

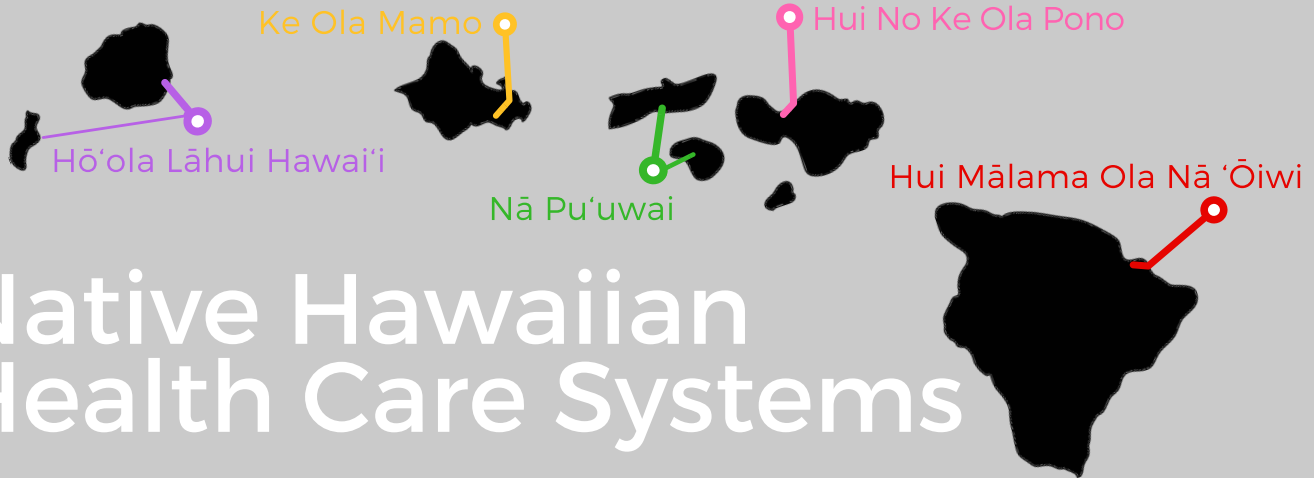
